

Stats.....

Youth mental health is worsening: Rates of youth with severe depression increased from 5.9% in 2012 to 8.2% in 2015. Even with severe depression, 76% of youth are left with no or insufficient treatment

Youth with At Least One Past Year Major Depressive Episode (MDE): 11.93% of youth (age 12-17) report suffering from at least one major depressive episode (MDE) in the past year. Major Depression is marked by significant and pervasive feelings of sadness that are associated with suicidal thoughts and impair a young person's ability to concentrate or engage in normal activities.

Data indicates a significant increase in the number of depressed youth across the county, annually.

8.2% of youth (or 1.9 million youth) experienced severe depression. Depressive symptoms result in significant interference in school, home and in relationships.

5.13% of youth in America report having a substance use or alcohol problem.

3.3 million youth reported the use of Marijuana, Cocaine, and/or Heroin.

Enhancements in Student Services

- New program at DHS for continuous programming for self-contained students with Structured Learning Environments embedded
- Life skills curriculum writing for grades K-12 allows for continuous programming for this population
- Support staff in working with students with significant behavioral disabilities and mental health
- Increase support for students struggling with mental health disorders
