BUSINESS/FINANCE

The Board approved a recommendation to close school on May 24, 2019 and May 28, 2019 as the result of only requiring one snow day this past winter. The Board also approved the 2020-2021 school calendar. You can find that information on the main page of the District website.

The Board approved a \$1,000 donation from Patient First to support the DIS Green Team and Student Council.

The Board approved new playground equipment to be installed at Millbridge and the purchase of new two way radios and a digital repeater system at DHS payable through a grant from the Burlington County Freeholders.

The Board also approved a salary guide for all hourly employees that is reflective of minimum wage legislation recently signed by Governor Murphy.

POLICY

The Board discussed the policy forecast for the remainder of the calendar year. There was also discussion regarding Board Bylaw 168: Recording of Board Meetings, whereupon Board members shared their opinions regarding video and audio recording of meetings. Bylaw 168 directs the creation and maintenance of an official record of the formal proceedings of the Board and permits the unofficial recording of Board meetings by members of the public. The bylaw does not require the Board to create official video or audio transcripts of its meetings. No action was taken.

STUDENT SUCCESS

The Board of Education honored the success of students that earned the New Jersey Department of Education Seal of Biliteracy. These students will be recognized at DHS graduation with a permanent seal on their diploma. This was the first year that DHS participated in this program and a high percentage of participants earned this designation.

The Board also honored students who earned honors in the PTA
Reflections contest and Burlington
County Teen Arts Festivals for middle and high school students.
