AP Scholar: granted to students who receive scores of **3** or higher on **3** or more AP Exams.

AP Scholar w/ Honors: granted to students who receive an **average** score of at least **3.25** on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on **four** or more exams.

AP Scholar w/ Distinction: granted to students who receive an **average** score of at least **3.5** on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on **five** or more exams.

National AP Scholar: 1 granted to students who receive an **average** score of at least **4.0** on all AP tests taken and scores of 4 or higher on **eight** or more exams

- Continue to address areas of weakness in specific courses
- Review curriculum and support the professional development of our teaching staff
- Continue to stress the importance of challenging oneself in the classroom
- How to encourage students to test? Do we pay? ~\$25,000

- Support teacher release time and attendance at AP training on a regular basis to keep up with the ever-changing College Board expectations
